Thank you Jose Ortiz, Retiring TVCSD General Manager

In December of 2015, Jose Ortiz was hired as TVCSD's GM to embark on a major transition to save staffing costs by 1/3rd & to increase agency transparency. Under Jose's leadership, staff, board & committees developed a 10-year financial plan & a 10-year Improvement Plan that guided our management of the sewer enterprise. After 11 years without a rate increase, we implemented a modest 2-year rate increase to redress rising costs & payment of pre-existing debt. Cash reserves have increased & agency debt has declined. Jose oversaw the CCTV collection system inspection throughout our service boundary area & discovered the pipes are in excellent condition & will not require complete slip-lining as previously thought. Despite the pandemic, Jose oversaw the construction of a new & enlarged Gazebo at the Park that TVCSD & key community members designed to be a centerpiece for future public enjoyment. Jose is retiring to enjoy more time traveling with his family. TVCSD will remember his professionalism, congeniality, & engineering attention to our small, efficient special district.



Financial Advisory Committee News, Melinda Bell, Chair



The sewer graph shows the amount of cash needed in order to pay the annual debt for sewer capital improvement projects prior to 2013.

However, the rate increases in 2018 & 2019 have enabled TVCSD to continue to repay our

debt, & slowly rebuild our

cash reserves to maintain more stability. We will finish paying the debt from the solar panel project this year & the sewer system improvements by 2025.

At the Park, prior to the Measure A 1/4 cent sales tax for public parks and open space, we were dependent on donations, grassroots fundraising and grants, and could undertake very limited improvements. Since 2013 with our annual Measure A allocations, we have been able to undertake major capital improvement

projects to rebuild the park and meet new standards for public safety. The June 7 Special Election will offer voters an opportunity to vote yes on Measure A to extend this small sales tax for an additional 10 years.
